Chairman's Update - April 2021.

It is important to remind ourselves of the key objectives of retaining an active and healthy Government Superannuitants Association.

This is to "provide a collective voice to protect the superannuation rights of Government employees who have contributed to one of the Government Superannuation Fund (GSF) schemes or the National Provident Fund (NPF) Defined Benefit Plan. The purpose of the GSA is to safeguard the current provisions of the GSF and NPF schemes and to improve them by having deficiencies and anomalies removed. The GSA has been the collective voice for Government annuitants since 1920."

The highlight of last year was the celebrations in commemoration of 100 years of GSA activity. Unfortunately the official celebration scheduled at Parliament to co-incide with National Council meeting was cancelled due to Covid-19. This was to launch a publication written by Professor Roger Openshaw outlining the history of the GSA over this period. Instead, this was successfully done at the National Council dinner.

Roger Openshaw was also the keynote speaker at our branch AGM. This was delayed from its usual May timeslot due to Covid-19 restrictions and eventually held in November concurrent with our Annual Christmas luncheon.

Hopefully this years activities, the AGM at the Kamo Club scheduled for 3 June, and our annual Christmas luncheon planned for 25 November, are less affected by the pandemic and there will be a good turnout of members.

National Council this year will be held on 4 and 5 September. Report back meetings for Northland members will be held in Whangarei on 21 September and another shortly after in the Far North.

The Northland branch committee continues to meet regularly with an enthusiastic group of members with the added advantage of including the National President Tony Hamilton. This keeps us up to date with National events and gives our branch a high profile in Wellington. Our branch remains financially sound.






Brian Painter, pictured here with Jane. He was the winner of a very nice bottle of wine for sitting in the mystery seat.

The resulting book places the GSA journey within the context of New Zealand's economic, social and political history. He is an active GSA member for the Manawatu branch.
