Government Superannuitants Association, Taranaki Branch: Chairman's Report: April 2024

Once more I am reporting as we come to the end of another year which has for me involved considerable distraction by family health issues.

At the 2023 Council meeting a workshop was held to look at requirements for the Strategic Plan to take the organisation into the future, as it is recognised that as membership declines and ages, the present structure will no longer be fit-for-purpose.

In following that up, the Board asked Branch Committees for their input. This was done at the Committee meeting in March. At the same meeting, the Draft Constitution, that has been produced to meet the requirements of the 2022 Incorporated Societies Act was also considered. The Committee made several suggestions that have been forwarded to our national office. Some of these relate to the Constitutional provisions for failing Branches. The Committee consider that amalgamation with a geographically adjacent Branch would fail to meet the Associations Objectives in respect of the membership of the failed Branch. It is considered that the administrative functions could be assigned to a centrally appointed Secretariat such as an expanded portfolio for the Executive Officer, or an administrator under the EO, and a local Committee responsible for more limited functions, such as arranging General meetings to be elected by the Branch.

At our Branch level, last year's AGM saw two volunteers come forward to join the Committee, and they were gratefully accepted. As a result, we have not had any problem with a quorum for the scheduled Committee meetings, and their input has been greatly appreciated. We still need new members to come forward to ensure continuity into the future, and to replace me, as I am willing to try and complete one more year only. I consider that any potential replacement should either have Chairperson's experience in a comparable organisation, or act as understudy for at least a year including attending at least one annual Council meeting. They should also be able to serve in the role for a few years, so need to be somewhat younger. Obviously, we still need new members to come forward to sustain the vitality of the Branch.

The Committee have been pleased by the numbers attending our meetings. At our Christmas meeting Bryan Hocken MNZM proved to be an interesting guest. We are aware that some members have problems hearing our speakers. The provision of a microphone for the sound system is usual, but it is difficult to judge the speaker's claims of the need, or not, to use the system, or the seats chosen by those who's hearing is not good (many of us) are best for that member's needs. Please let us know if you are unable to hear the speaker so that we can remedy the situation if possible. A speaker from Taranaki Civil Defence will be our guest at our AGM. Our Board representative, Alan Peck also plans to attend.

A Board directive has made it clear that in setting the level of subsidy for General Branch meetings the total cost of the function is the basis for calculating the 50% contribution from Branch funds. Applying these criteria will result in some increase in the cost to members for future meetings. The Committee believes that the Plymouth Hotel is still the best venue available to us for our meetings. However, we remain open to input if you should think that there is a better option.

There have at times been calls from the floor suggesting that the balance in the Branch accounts could be spent extravagantly. All our members have come from the Public Service where, I believe, honesty and integrity were requirements for recruitment. The funds in a Branches accounts are money that belongs to the Association and I will not sanction expenditure outside of the National policies for the management of those funds while I hold my present position.

Lastly, I thank the existing committee for their support, and I thank those who attend our general meetings.
