#### **Annual Report 2024**

Welcome members and visitors to the 2024 Annual General Meeting of the Wellington Branch of GSA. The past year has had some challenges but, overall, has been a successful one.

Early in the year, Catherine Chang, our branch secretary. took up 12 months leave of absence for maternity and childcare and has expressed keenness to resume her role with us shortly. Thanks must go to Kay Monks who put her hand up and took over part of the secretarial role in Catherine's absence assisted by myself.

The branch 2023 AGM was held at the Petone Club in June and was attended by 56 members. The election of officers took place and the following keen team were elected to the committee: Chair Mike Smith, Deputy Chair Ian Clunies-Ross Committee Members Kevin Duggan, Bryan Whisker, Suzanne Holgate, Ray Woolhouse, Kay Monks and Edgar Spark. Since the AGM, David Scott has also joined the committee.

The Branch continues to have strong finances but, as time takes its toll, our membership is continuing to decline at a similar rate to national GSA membership trends.

During the year your committee was able to provide a full schedule of social activities, and these proved to be popular with members. Our thanks go to the McKenzie Trust for the support given by providing free bus transport to several of these events.

For this branch to remain strong and useful to members we need to have a committee of clear and diverse minds. Wellington Branch invites you to join with us and contribute to the running of the branch by offering a nomination to take up a role on our committee. The effort involved is not onerous with meetings six times per year, usually for a duration of less than two hours. I strongly urge you to give this your thoughtful consideration.

The mid-winter lunch was held in July at the James Cook Hotel Grand Chancellor was attended by 60 people. Bill Robertson, our guest speaker for the occasion, gave an illuminating address on the necessity for G S Fund members to belong to GSA as a means of having a voice to be used for the protection of their annuities. He gave a reminder that there is no one else to hold the present or future governments to account to live up to the promise previous governments made to us.

The annual Council meeting was held in September with delegates from all branches. President Tony Hamilton stood down from his roll and Alan Straker (Marlborough) was appointed unopposed as President. Sandra Gusscott (Auckland) was also appointed unopposed as Vice President. Other current members of the Board were re-elected: Robert Beckham (Southland), Anne Gover (Southland), Michael Law (Waikato King Country) and Alan Peck (Wellington). One vacancy remained which was filled by the nomination and appointment of Roger Openshaw (Manawatu).

Our annual Wairarapa luncheon was again held at the Masterton Club in September and local members were able to mix with and enjoy a very pleasant luncheon with several members who had travelled over from Wellington for the event.

By November it was time for our Christmas luncheon and once again the venue was Te Marua Golf Club where 61 members enjoyed good food and company in very pleasant surroundings. The Board be able to host Roger at this event. In return Roger addressed the gathering on the current work of the Board.

During the year the branch committee met on six occasions to deal with the operation of the branch, and it was always pleasing to work within the co-operative atmosphere generated by the committee. In December, Suzanne Holgate stepped aside from the committee to pursue other personal interests. During her time with the Committee Suzanne has been very energetic by taking a keen interest in membership recruitment, particularly in the education sector spending numerous hours visiting schools promoting GSA to pre annuitants.
