Message from Chairperson- Alan Straker

Greetings to all members of the Marlborough Branch of GSA.

I'd like to begin my message by acknowledging the work of your local committee over the past year and the contribution they make to the running of our Branch. At the AGM in June, Colin Draper who has completed several years as secretary stepped down from this role. I want to acknowledge Colin's contribution to our Association. I also wish to thank Barbara Hutchinson for taking on the secretary's job. The remainder of the committee comprises: Noel Frater (treasurer), Alan McEvoy, Brian Bridgman, Joan Palmer, Peter Sangwine and David Jones). Barbara and David attended the Annual Council meeting held in September as your representatives.

Locally your committee has met each month to discuss and respond to issues affecting our members as well as planning activities for our Branch. Our March meeting was a combined one with our Nelson counterparts and by the time you read this we would have held a meeting in Picton and one in Kaikoura for members in those areas. Numbers for our AGM held in June were down on last year and we need to ensure that as many of you as possible attend to help keep you informed of branch and national activities. Attending your AGM doesn't mean you have to take on a committee role! Having said that it would be good for some others to put their hand up and put in a few hours each year to contribute to the committee.

At Council this year I was elected to the position of Vice President of our National Board. I have found this work both interesting and rewarding especially our Association's role in keeping the government of the day accountable for decisions made regarding your annuity. Governments come and go, and often big chunks of institutional knowledge can disappear quickly, so this makes GSA more important than ever in protecting the conditions of your annuity.

As at the end of March our local membership number was 563 (300 being annuitants with the balance being spouses or those still in the workforce) Overall this represented a drop of 10 members from the previous year. You'll be aware that our numbers are shrinking each year but nationally the Board are working hard to recruit new members. In the past year we have lost 800 members nationally but there are some 25,000 annuitants who choose not to belong to our association.

I am pleased to report that the petition regarding the 100% cost of living adjustment being paid to all members we sent to parliament last year worked it's way through the select committee stage and received a positive recommendation for the government to right this anomaly in our scheme. The recommendation is back with the Minister of Finance and the Board are seeking a meeting with him to keep pushing this issue which affects approximately 6000 of our members

I look forward to your attendance at the Xmas function, details of which are contained elsewhere in this newsletter.
