REPORT ON WAIKATO BRANCH AGM, 9 JUNE

As Covid lockdowns delayed our 2020 AGM until November, 2020, our 2021 AGM in June covered only a few months. The highlight of the meeting was a very informative address by GSA National Board member, Marjorie Thomas, who is responsible for liaison with our branch.

As at 31 March 2021, The Waikato-King Country Branch had 1,399 members, a small drop from 1,430 a year earlier. Of our March 2021 membership, 731 were annuitants, 397 were spouses of annuitants, 210 were surviving spouses, 32 were pre-annuitants, and 29 were spouses of pre-annuitants.

Our Branch finances remain strong, even though we hold four regional lunches, the most distant in Taumarunui. As at 31 March, we had 974 subscription-paying members (that is, annuitants, surviving spouses, and pre-annuitants) and we ran a surplus of \$1,329.

REPORT ON HAMILTON MORNING TEA, 28 JULY

In July, we resumed our social morning tea and guest speaker programme. We welcomed Brent Nielsen from Age Concern Hamilton who spoke to over 30 members.

Brent gave an interesting and entertaining talk about the work of Age Concern. He highlighted the many different areas where they offer support to older people. These include:

- visiting services;
- elder abuse response;
- shopping support; and
- health and wellbeing programmes.

Brent illustrated his talk with several examples. Some heart-warming, some light hearted; some sad ; and some alarming.

Hoarding was quite a common theme. Another was financial abuse by family members of elderly relatives. This, he noted, occurs too frequently.

On a more positive note, Age Concern offers a range of courses on health and well-being directly to older people. These are fun, sociable and usually interactive courses where we can learn to take control of our own health and well-being needs.

DIRECTIONS TO HAMILTON WORKINGMEN'S CLUB

The Hamilton Workingmen's Club is located at 45 Commerce St, Frankton.

It is best to enter Commerce Street from Norton Road. The Workingmen's Club is approximately half way down the first block, on the left-hand side. There is plenty of parking. From the parking area, good signage indicates the path to the Pavilion, which is to the right as you drive in.

From the North: Take Te Rapa Road into Ulster St. Turn right into Mill St. Turn left into Norton Rd. Turn Right into Commerce St.

From the West: Take Massey St. to Norton Rd. Turn right into Norton Rd. Turn right into Commerce St.

From the South: Drive to Tristram Street. Turn left into Tristram St (at Pak'n'Sav). Continue on Tristram St to Ward St. Turn left into Ward Street which becomes Seddon Road. Continue along Seddon Road to Norton Road. Turn left into Commerce St.

From the North-East, cross the Waikato River at a preferred bridge. Drive West down Mill Street to Norton Road. Turn right into Norton Road. Turn right into Commerce Street.
