Some of the major items on the agenda include:

A number of new members have put their names forward for election to the Board. The need for an election demonstrates that our organisation is healthy, strong, and robust.

Meetings are held when required, and the relevant tasks are completed on your behalf. I would like to thank them on the work they do.
