Chairperson's Report

In any "normal" year, this Newsletter would be easy to write because it would follow the annual Council meeting in September, giving me plenty of topics to discuss. This is the third Newsletter in a very "not normal" period of 18 months where Covid-19 has dictated proceedings. I took a risk in April this year when I suggested that "Perhaps we are moving into a year of much greater certainty ...", a sentiment which lasted only 4 months before the majority of NZ's population was severely locked-down and now with only partial success, perhaps the philosophy of eliminating Covid will sadly be relegated to dreamland.

The GSA Council meeting could not happen in September and the next best dates, when the Wellington hotel would be available, was October 23rd and 24th, which coincides with Labour Weekend. Many delegates can still attend but unfortunately, one of our delegates, Gavin Stuart has a prior family engagement that weekend. We have not been able to replace Gavin so our Branch will be represented by me as the only delegate. This does not affect our voting strength which, should a card-vote be called, is based on the number of members in the Branch. Ironically, if the Covid Level stays at Level 2, as now seems likely, the Wellington hotel (West Plaza) may limit GSA to just one delegate per Branch, to be able to maintain social distancing.

At Council last year there was no election needed for any position on the Board because there was just the right number of candidates. This year there will be an election for 5 members of the Board from 7 nominations received. The President, Tony Hamilton (Northland) and Vice President, Alan Straker (Marlborough), will be returned unopposed. One member who is not standing this year, was our last

Branch-Board liaison, Dallas Elvy. He will be missed for his pleasant manner, quiet thoughtful approach and good advice.

Within our Branch, Bernie Rose has for many years, organised the birthday visits to members and carried out other work on behalf of the Walker Trust. Bernie will continue visiting members and remain as our Walker Trust Social Convenor. Our Secretary Janine will carry out the other functions associated with the Trust. Many thanks Bernie for your devoted service.

At our Annual Meeting in May, Graham and Christine Payne didn't stand for the Committee this year and Neil Carter was unavailable for medical reasons. We thank all three for their contribution.

We had a guest speaker at the Annual Meeting: Simon Templeton, CEO of Age Concern Canterbury. Simon described an Organisation dedicated to helping older people and I was impressed in just how many ways Age Concern could help. If you have a need, or see others who might need help with anything, give Age Concern a thought. They may have an answer.

Another feature of our Annual Meeting was a negative one, and highlighted by Dallas Elvy when he was present as our Board representative. The attendance at our meeting was extremely small. (I calculate the number to be around 0.6% of our membership). Perhaps it was because the lock-downs of last year meant that we had the 2020 and 2021 Annual Meetings within 6 months. Perhaps I shouldn't be concerned. A number of years ago GSA ran a survey of members throughout the country, asking questions about what members wanted from the Association. More than 80% of respondents said that they just wanted the GSA To preserve the conditions of their annuity and providing social occasions was not a priority. Is our Annual Meeting just another "social occasion"?
