Both Neil Elgar and I have recently returned from Wellington after attending the annual Council meeting. Each of the associates 19 branches usually send 2 delegates to this important event. The GSA Council and elected Board, discuss our current policies and set the future directions for our organisation.

The main discussion topic for this meeting was a paper entitled 'The Future of the GSA – a long Term Perspective. The GSF scheme closed to new members in 1992. It goes without saying that members of the scheme are ageing and eventually numbers will reduce to zero over a period estimated to be 40 plus years.

The task of our organisation is to safeguard the provisions of the GSF for all of members. We do not want some future government reducing the benefits that we have paid for over the many years of contributing to the fund during our working years.

A number of recommendations were discussed and voted upon at the meeting. Details of these will be presented to you at our next meeting and will be published in future GSA publications, mainly our "Annuity News"

Our guest speaker at the Council Meeting was Simon Taylor, the CEO of the Govt. Super Fund. This organisation manages our contributions, some 4 billion dollars! The returns made on the investment do not affect our annuity as the government has to make up the difference in order to pay out our regular entitlements. Here are a few interesting facts:

- 2016/17 \$874 million paid to members
- \$68 million every 4 weeks – 15 million from our fund and 53 million from the government

Currently we have about 46000 members receiving the annuity and about 4000 current contributors.

Our organisation will celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2 years' times. We all need to make sure that the GSA continues to be a strong advocate for our members. We can all help by supporting our local branch and by recruiting new members.

All the best for the future. Enjoy Christmas and a happy new year to you all.
