## 2019 AGM and Luncheon

A combined Annual General Meeting and luncheon was held at the Petone Working Men's Club on 29 May 2019. Forty nine members attended. Through the year 3 committee members, Colin MacIntosh, Janice Campbell and Wilf Haskell had resigned. All three were thanked for their valuable contributions over a number of years. The committee now stands at 9, including the Chair and Deputy Chair, as no new members were nominated. Bryan Whisker has been co-opted to represent the Wairarapa. Any member interested in joining the committee would be very welcome.

Wellington branch membership as at 31 March 2019 is 5,245, a decline of 130 or 2.4% from the previous year. This is slightly better than the national membership with a 3% decline.

The financial report for the year ending 31 March 2019 showed a surplus of \$10,997. This can be attributed to an increase in the GSA subscription from \$1.65 to \$2 and the National Office in 2018 taking over the \$3,000 printing cost of producing two branch newsletters. With this surplus, the branch committee decided to reduce the cost from \$29 to \$10 for members wishing to attend the AGM

and luncheon and the Wairarapa function as both these meetings are seen as business meetings and members are encouraged to attend. The Chairman thanked the SuperTravel Fund enabling members to access a free bus to events. The Mackenzie Trust is also able to support individual members who have difficulty in accessing the current transport provisions. If requested, a taxi can be provided either directly to the venue or to the bus being used by other members.

## 2020 Annual General Meeting

In the meantime please mark in your diary the date of the **2020 AGM to be held on 3 June 2020**. The current GSA President Tony Hamilton has expressed a wish to attend our AGM and to speak to our Wellington members. Your committee hopes many members will make a special effort to attend this meeting.

## Mid-Winter Luncheon

The Wellington Branch was host to the Honorable Tracey Martin at its Mid-Winter function at The Pines, Island Bay on July 24. Amidst her very busy parliamentary schedule the Minister found time to join us for lunch and then speak about a vision for Seniors that will extend into the future for the next 15 years. Addressing the sixty GSA members attending the Minister described her wide-ranging portfolio that in addition to Minister for Seniors, included her being Minister for Internal Affairs, Minister for Children, and Associate Minister for Education. She quipped that she had responsibility for diverse areas such as racing and boxing right through to gambling as well as the census.

It was important that the new strategy reflected the profound changes happening within society she explained, particularly relating to the increase in the population of those over 65 years where in 10 years' time, this group will outnumber all under 15 year olds. This trend will continue further with seniors

living longer healthier lives. The five key aims of the government's "**Better Later Life**" draft strategy are:

**1. Prepare for financial and economic security:** NZ Superannuation is an inviolate social contract but often it is not sufficient. Currently 48% of those over 55 years do not own their own home and as this trend extends to retirees then the need for accommodation supplements will increasingly stretch government resources. Therefore more people will need or want to work beyond 65 and this is to be encouraged.

**2. Improving access to health and social services:** Implementing the "Healthy Aging Strategy" is an important start and this must go hand-in-hand with improving access for vulnerable older people to those services.

**3. Providing housing choices:** Provide more housing is vital as well as enabling seniors to age in the community with less emphasis on moving to separate villages.

**4. Enhancing opportunities for social connection and participation:** Changing societal attitudes towards older citizens to combat age discrimination and elder abuse is an imperative. One initiative is a \$600,000 fund for learning digital skills to enable seniors to be better connected.

**5. Accessible built environments:** Creating age friendly communities that are built to encourage seniors to get out and about.

The Minister spoke passionately about seniors staying active and continuing to participate in what can be described as a 'portfolio' life style, a mixture of work, family support and volunteering. She would make sure she was part of the government's 'Future of Work Planning

Committee' because of her belief that barriers to continuing work must be reduced and that too many seniors leave the world of work prematurely or unnecessarily. Part-time work and casual workers are needed and seniors have skills and knowledge that should not be lost simply because the age of 65 is reached. "Retire the word retirement" is her motto.

Those attending did not get the impression the Minister was saying that we all should be working rather than there needs to be more flexibility and perhaps 'retirement' would be better replaced by 'transition'. (Cont' on page 3)

The Minister has won a \$7.7 million fund to enhance the SuperGold card. The SuperGold card web-site will be redesigned and a phone app developed that

will locate discounts near the current location of the phone. The possible discounts might include travel dental care, insurance and trade offers. The "Better Later Life" final document was released on International Seniors Day on 1 October 2019.

It was a pleasure to host the Minister and the meeting was encouraged by her enthusiasm for her role as Minister for Seniors.

### Wairarapa Luncheon

The luncheon was held on Thursday 26 September at the Masterton Club. As agreed at the AGM, the forty six members who attended each paid \$10 for the two course meal. The meal and the service were both excellent.

This annual luncheon is an opportunity specifically for GSA members living in Wairarapa to be brought up to date on GSA matters discussed at the national Council meeting which was held in Wellington in the first weekend of September. It was also a chance for members to ask questions of Wellington Committee members present on any issue relating to their annuities.

Ian Clunies-Ross, the branch Chair, advised members that Alan Peck and Mike Smith, two Wellington branch committee members, and Dllas Elvy, the branch member were elected as Board members. He also acknowledged the two long standing Wellington branch Board members, Bill Robertson and Bryan Whisker, who had stepped down from the Board after many years of valuable service to GSA and acknowledging that their institutional knowledge could well be called upon in

the years ahead. Bryan has agreed to represent Wairarapa as a co-opted member on the Wellington branch committee.

Other issues commented upon at the meeting and relating to the Council meeting included a defeated proposal to increase the membership fee, the CoLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) petition and some GSA constitutional amendments.
